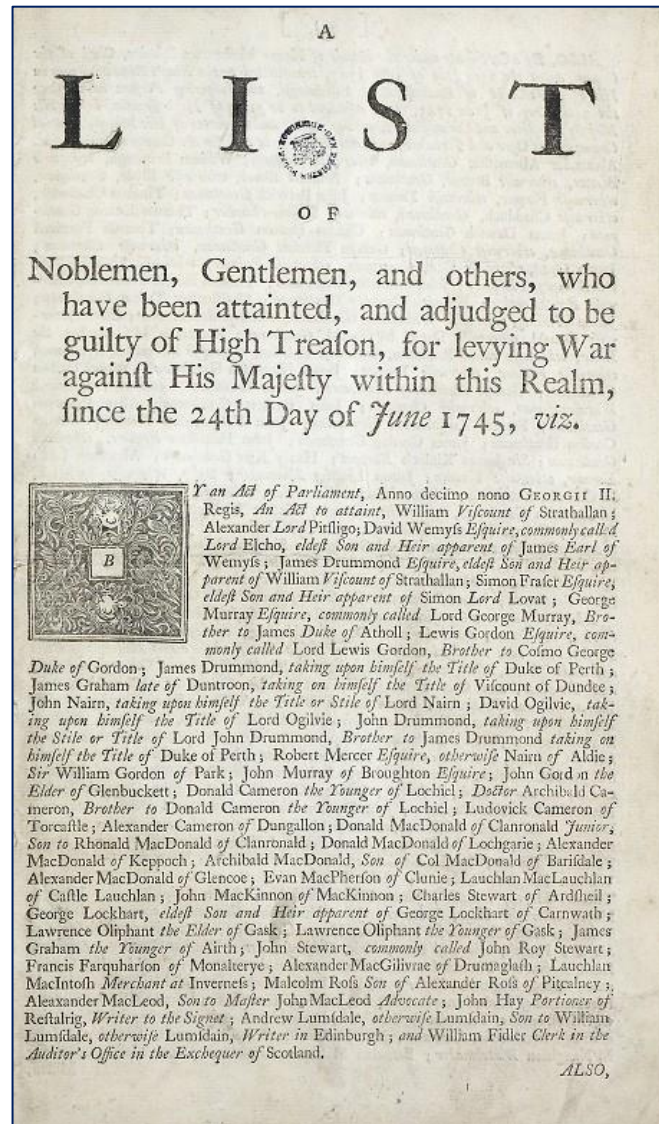

These records cover almost all aspects of the revenue raising and expenditure of the Crown in Scotland. The pre-union Exchequer comprises the following series of records; administrative and judicial (E1-E20); treasury, comptrollery and related accounts (E21-E37); crown revenues (E38-E44); church revenues (E45-E56); fines and forfeitures (E57-E58); taxation accounts and records (E59-E70); Customs and Excise (E71-E80); miscellaneous revenue accounts (E81-E89); army and navy accounts and papers (E90-E100); mint records (E101-E105); special classes (E101-E109).

Post 1707 records include revenue accounts 1699-1835 (E201-E211); civil establishment records from 1708 listing salaries to central government officials (E223-E229); taxation records 1748-1812 (E326-E328); roads accounts 1812-1847 (E330); Crinan Canal papers 1802-1844 (E331); historic buildings 1711-1873 (E342, E886); court records, including minutes, decrees and processes, including revenue cases but principally relating to disputes over taxes 1708-1856 (E351-E383); customs records including customs collectors' accounts detailing imports and exports, payments of whale and herring bounties and information on customs officers 1742-1820 (E501-E516); distillery vouchers naming proprietors and owners of distilleries (excluding the workers)

granted an allowance of 1/- on every gallon of whisky produced from malt (E581); Annexed Forfeited Estate papers including the records of the management of the major Jacobite estates forfeited after the risings of 1715 and 1745 and showing attempts to improve agriculture, industry and communications in the Highlands and including rentals, plans and accounts (E600-E687, E701-E788); Ultimus Haeres papers from 1709 which are records of the Crown as 'last heir' of those dying without a known heir (E851-E870). The modern records may be subject to different closure periods.

The Annexing Act of 26 March 1752

An Act for annexing certain Forfeited Estates in Scotland to the Crown unalienably, and for making Satisfaction to the lawful Creditors thereupon, and to establish a Method of managing the same, and applying the Rents and Profits thereof for the better civilizing and improving The Highlands of Scotland, and preventing Disorders there for the future.

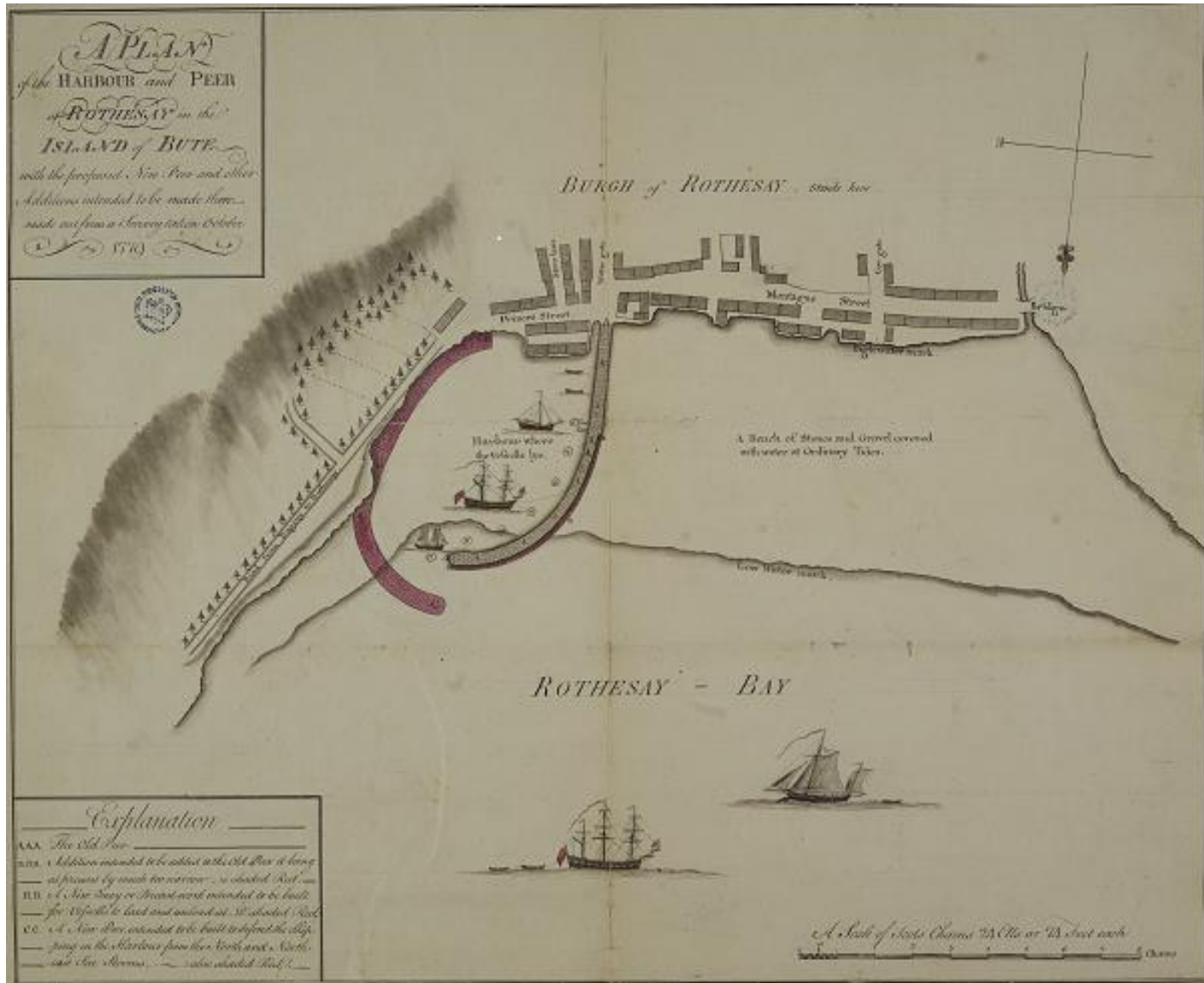

ANNEXED ESTATES OFFICE, February 6. 1764.

The COMMISSIONERS of ANNEXED ESTATES do hereby give Notice to all Tenants and Possessors of these Estates, who have no Leases, That it will greatly recommend them to long Leases of their several Possessions, if they follow the Method of Agriculture hereto annexed, *viz.*

- I. ALL who have Runrig, or Kavel, to apply to the Factor for having the same properly divided.
- II. ALL who have crooked or uneven Marches, to apply in like Manner for having them straightened and adjusted with their Neighbours.
- III. To drain their Grounds well.
- IV. To Winter herd.

THOSE in Possessions, where there is a large Portion of arable Land,

- V. To Summer fallow.
- VI. To sow Grass Seeds on their In-field, and keep a large Portion thereof always in Grass.
- VII. To manage their arable Out fields in the same Manner as In-fields, and lay aside the pernicious Method hitherto practised, of running out Lands by constant Crops of Oats after Oats.
- VIII. To sow Turneps, Potatoes, and other green Crops.

THOSE who have Highland Farms, where there is little arable Land,

- IX. To trench with the Spade the little Spots in the Glens, where they can raise Corns, Hay, or green Crops, to increase as much as may be their Winter Fodder.

Advertisement to encourage settlement of disbanded soldiers and sailors, 1763

ADVERTISEMENT.

For the Encouragement of discharged SAILORS and disbanded
SOLDIERS.

THE COMMISSIONERS, appointed by his Majesty for managing the Forfeited Estates in *Scotland* (which, by an Act of the 25th Year of his late Majesty, were annexed to the Crown unalienably, for the Purposes of civilizing the *Highlands of Scotland*) have resolved to bestow, out of the Rents of these Estates, the Sum of 6,610*l. Sterl.* in Bounties for encouraging discharged Sailors and Marines (to the Number of 1000) who have served on Board his Majesty's Navy in the last War, to settle as Fishers on the Sea Coast of the *Highlands of Scotland*. And to bestow the further Sum of 3,000*l. Sterl.* for encouraging disbanded Soldiers (to the Number of 500) who have served his Majesty in the last War, to settle on the Annexed Estates, as Artificers, Manufacturers, or Day-labourers.

The Encouragement to Sailors is as follows.

To each Sailor or Marine, who shall settle as a Fisher on any of the Coasts of the Annexed Estates, a Bounty of 2*l. Sterl.* with a Boat fit for the Herring and Cod Fishing, to each Crew of eight Men.

And further, to each married Sailor or Marine, a Dwelling-house and a Portion of Ground not exceeding three Acres, Rent free for seven Years, and thereafter at a Rent not exceeding 5*s. Sterl. per* Acre.

To each Sailor or Marine who shall settle as a Fisher on such Parts of the Coast as does not ly within the Annexed Estates, a Bounty of 3*l. Sterl.* and his House Rent to be paid for three Years.

The Encouragement to Soldiers is as follows.

That for married Soldiers, who settle upon the Annexed Estates, Dwelling-houses shall be built to the Number of 300, to be possessed by them Rent free for Life.

That 3*l. Sterl.* shall be paid to each of them for providing Household Furniture.

That a Portion of Ground, not exceeding three Acres, shall be allotted unto each of them, for raising Corn, Hay, Pot-herbs, &c. to maintain his Family, and to feed one Cow. These small Farms to be Rent free for the first three Years, and thereafter to pay a Rent not exceeding 5*s. Sterl. per* Acre.

That each unmarried Soldier (to the Number of 200) who settles on these Estates, shall have yearly, for three Years, a Premium of twenty Shillings; and if any of them shall marry within three Years, Houses and Possessions shall be provided for them as above.

That, till these Houses can be built, the Commissioners will employ, in the public Works, now carrying on upon these Estates, disbanded Soldiers to the Number of 500.

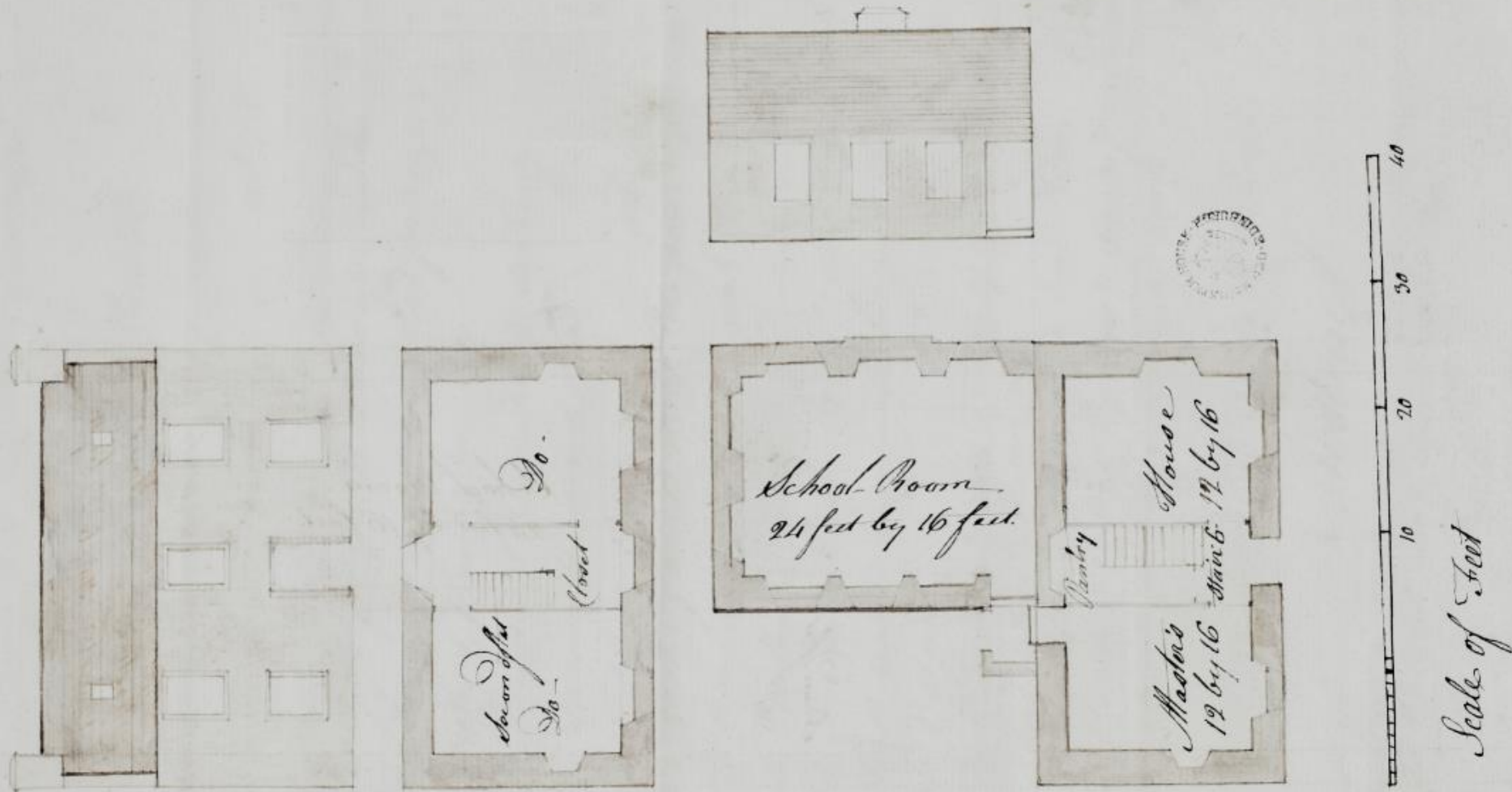

WARRANTS under the Privy Seal, &c. for issuing Money for the purpose of Building and Supporting the GENERAL REGISTER HOUSE.

1. WARRANT for issuing L. 12,000, for purchasing ground, and building a Repository for the public Records.—20th June, 1765.

TRUSTY and Well-beloved, we greet you well. Whereas it has been represented unto us by the President and Judges of our Court of Session, in that part of our United Kingdom called Scotland, and by you our Chief Baron, and the Barons of our Court of Exchequer there, That the repository for Records in that part of our said Kingdom is, by the continual and necessary increase of the number of such Records, become greatly insufficient for preserving the same in a safe and proper manner; and being mostly underground, some of the Records are thereby effaced, many of them rotting, and all of them in imminent danger of being destroyed. AND we being willing to prevent and remedy the great mischief and inconvenience that may thereby arise, are graciously pleased to grant and allow the sum of Twelve Thousand pounds towards purchasing ground, and building a proper Repository for the said Records. Our Will and Pleasure therefore is, and we do hereby direct,
